Consumer Tips: Opt Out

Tired of getting unwanted sales pitches by mail, over the phone, and through email? If you want to reduce those solicitations, you can “opt out” by letting marketers know you are not interested.

- To stop receiving unsolicited credit card offers, call 1-888-567-8688, the opt out number for the three major credit reporting bureaus.
- Tell each unwanted caller to put your name on the company’s “do-not-call” list.
- Tell your department of motor vehicles that you do not want your driver’s license information sold to marketers.
